

### Example 1

Billed in cubic feet (CCF), less than 100,000 gallons total water usage.

The water company bills some customers in cubic feet "ccf" and some customers in gallons. If you are billed in "ccf" you must first convert to gallons by multiplying "ccf" by 748. If you are billed in gallons you do not have to convert.

Once the calculation is made for the six month billing period you must multiply this amount by 2 to annualize the calculation.

\* Water Users over 400,000 gallons are billed \$6,225.00 for the first 400,000 gallons and .02185 per gallon in excess of 400,000 gallons.
