**ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2021 REVISED AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE MEMBER MUNICIPALITIES OF THE
RAHWAY VALLEY SEWERAGE AUTHORITY**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the Township of Clark, County of Union, State of New Jersey (“Clark”), as follows:

Section 1.

Clark hereby approves the amendments to the 2021 Agreement with regard to the establishment and operation of the Rahway Valley Sewerage Authority.

Section 2.

The amendments to the 2021 Agreement are set out in red-line and are attached as Appendix A (“Revisions to 2021 Agreement”).

Section 3. Severability.

If any section, clause, paragraph, or provision of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to that section, so adjudged, and the remainder of this Ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

Section 4. Inconsistency.

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHAPTER 48, SECTION 48-5, OF THE CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CLARK ENTITLED "EMPLOYEE POLICY AND PROCEDURE MANUAL," AND THE SUBSECTION ENTITLED "PART-TIME EMPLOYEES" OF THE SECTION ENTITLED "VACATION LEAVE POLICY" OF SECTION THREE ENTITLED "LEAVES OF ABSENCE" OF THE EMPLOYEE POLICY AND PROCEDURE MANUAL

BE IT ORDAINED by the Governing Body of the Township of Clark that Chapter 48, Section 48-5, of the Code of the Township of Clark entitled "Employee Policy and Procedure Manual," and the subsection entitled "Part-Time Employees" of the Section entitled "Vacation Leave Policy" of Section Three entitled "Leaves of Absence" of the Employee Policy and Procedure Manual be and hereby are amended as follows:

WHEREAS, the Township of Clark has previously adopted an Employee Policy and Procedure Manual; and

WHEREAS, such Employee Policy and Procedure Manual was last revised February 9, 2022 pursuant to Ordinance 22-01; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Township of Clark wishes to amend the aforesaid Ordinance and adopt a revised and updated Employee Policy and Procedure Manual.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED as follows:

SECTION 1: Section 48-5 of the Code of the Township of Clark be and hereby is amended to state as follows:

All Township employees are subject to and shall otherwise abide by the policies and procedures set forth in the Employee Policy and Procedure Manual adopted 1996, revised 2003, 2008, 2010, 2012, 2014, 2016, 2018, 2021, and was further revised on February 9, 2022, and the provisions contained therein shall be fully operative regarding all aspects of employment, except to the extent that the same may conflict or be inconsistent with such policies and procedures as may be specified in any collective bargaining agreement(s), which agreement(s) shall supersede the provisions hereof, or any state or federal codes, rules or regulations, which shall preempt the provisions hereof. All Township employees shall receive a copy of said revised Employee Policy and Procedure Manual upon the adoption of this Ordinance or upon the commencement of their employment, as the case may be.

Resolution Opposing the Increases to the State Health Benefits Program

WHEREAS the State Health Benefits Program (SHBP), governed by N.J.S.A. 52:14-17.25 et seq., offers medical, prescription drug, and dental coverage to qualified State and participating local government public employees, retirees, and eligible dependents; and

WHEREAS all SHBP plans are self-funded meaning that the money paid out for benefits comes directly from a SHBP fund supplied by the State, participating local employers, and member premiums; and

WHEREAS the Division of Pensions and Benefits is responsible for the daily administrative activities of the SHPB, the State Health Benefits Commission is the executive organization responsible for overseeing the SHBP; and

WHEREAS the State Health Benefits Commission, comprised of state officials and union representatives, annually consider the calendar year premium levels for the Local Government Employer Group of the SHBP based on recommendations found in the Rate Setting Recommendation Analysis of the Local Government Employee Group; and

WHEREAS the State Health Benefits Commission approved rate increases for the 2023 Local Government Employer Group is 22.8%, which includes a 21.6% increase for Active, a 13% increase in Early Retiree, and a 0.7% increase for Medicare Retiree; and

WHEREAS subsequent news accounts have Department of Treasury noting “rates for active members and early retirees would likely be increase between 12-20% across the various plans for the upcoming year”; and

WHEREAS such exorbitant rate increases will fall upon the local property taxpayer along with the local public employees at a time where there is record inflation, and

WHEREAS the premium increase for most active employees will take thousands more out of their paychecks annually and lead to huge costs for local governments that will translate into higher property tax bills for struggling families.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Body of the Township of Clark in the County of Union call up the State Health Benefit Commission to reconsider the rate increase and strike a rate increase that is appropriate in the current economic conditions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOVLED that the Governing Body of the Township of Clark in the County of Union urge the legislature to adopt legislation expanding the composition of the State Health Benefits Commission to include representatives from both municipal and county government management; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Murphy, State Treasurer Muoio, Senate President Scutari, Assembly Speaker Coughlin, Assemblywoman Carter, Assemblyman Kennedy, and the New Jersey State League of Municipalities.

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Township of Clark by Resolution 22-63 authorized the Planning Board to undertake a preliminary investigation of properties known as Block 91, Lots 8.01, 10.01, 36 and 37 as shown on the Tax Map (“Study Area”) to determine whether these properties qualify as an Area in Need of Non-Condensation Redevelopment pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body by Resolution 22-80 clarified the specific Block and Lot designations of the properties within the Study Area because there had been a renumbering of the Block and Lot designations on the Tax Map; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Clark Planning Board by Resolution dated May 5, 2022 directed Paul N. Ricci, P.P., A.I.C.P., the Township Planner, to prepare a report in order to determine if the properties within the Study Area qualify as an Area in Need of Non-Condensation Redevelopment pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 *et seq.*; and

WHEREAS, the Township Planner prepared a report titled “Redevelopment Study and Preliminary Investigation Report, Block 91, Lots 8.01, 10.01, 36 and 37” (“Redevelopment Study”) dated July 13, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board conducted a public hearing on August 4, 2022 to determine whether the properties within the Study Area qualify for designation as an Area in Need of Non-Condensation Redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, representatives of the owner of Block 91, Lot 37 appeared at the Planning Board public hearing and objected to that property being designated as part of an Area in Need of Non-Condensation Redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, no other members of the public appeared at the Planning Board hearing; and

WHEREAS, the Redevelopment Study concluded that Study Area satisfies the statutory criteria for being declared an area in need of non-condemnation redevelopment in accordance with the Local Redevelopment and Housing Law, N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-5 as follows:

- a. Block 91, Lot 8.01 within the Study Area qualifies under criteria “a”, “d” and “h” for designation as an area in need of non-condemnation redevelopment.
- b. Block 91, Lot 10.01 within the Study Area qualifies under criteria “d” and “h” for designation as an area in need of non-condemnation redevelopment.
- c. Block 91, Lots 36 and 37 within the Study Area qualify as part of a redevelopment area because each is necessary for the effective redevelopment of the Study Area and under criteria “h” for designation as an area in need of non-condemnation redevelopment, and

WHEREAS, the Planning Board after considering the objections of the owner of Block 91, Lot 37 accepted the findings and recommendations set forth in the Redevelopment Study and the testimony of Paul Ricci and recommended that the Township Council declare the Study Area to be an Area in Need of Non-Condensation Redevelopment; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body reviewed the Redevelopment Study, Planning Board Resolution and further considered the matter; and

WHEREAS, the Governing Body exercising the discretion granted to it by N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-6(5)(b), that the Governing Body “[a]fter receiving the recommendation of the planning board, . . . may adopt a resolution determining that the delineated area, or any part thereof, is a redevelopment area” hereby finds that Block 91, Lot 37 is not necessary for and should not be designated as part of the Area in Need of Non-Condensation Redevelopment because of the objections of that property owner and because the Governing Body believes that the goal of redeveloping the Study Area will be achieved without Block 91, Lot 37.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Governing Body of the Township of Clark on this 17th day of October, 2022 that the properties identified as Lots 8.01, 10.01 and 36 on the Tax Map, but not Block 91, Lot 37, be designated an Area in Need of Non-Condensation Redevelopment pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12A-1 et seq.; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Clerk is hereby directed to forward the Council Resolution and Redevelopment Study to all the property owners with the Study Area and the Department of Community Affairs within ten (10) days of adoption by the Township Council.
